



Helpful Hints

VERY IMPORTANT—GAUGE is the most important element in knitting and crocheting. If your gauge is correct, the finished garment will be the size indicated in the directions. If necessary, change to larger or smaller needles to maintain the correct stitch and row gauge. The important thing to remember is that the size of the needle does not matter as long as you maintain the stitch and row gauge quoted for the specific item you are making.

WASHING DIRECTIONS:

1. Wash in lukewarm water, never hot water, using a mild detergent.
2. Rinse thoroughly, removing all the detergent.
3. In last rinsing water use 2 tablespoons of vinegar to 2 or 3 gallons of water.
4. Remove excess water, placing Turkish towels above and below sweater, and between layers of front, back and sleeves. Roll and squeeze. Repeat if necessary.

NOTE: Never use an automatic dryer, except for Spinnerin Orlon Sayelle Express.

5. Never permit a sweater to lie around wet or even damp . . . quick-drying is important.
6. Place on dry Turkish towel to dry, blocking to proper size.

NOTE: Never dry in sun. NEVER PRESS

BLOCKING: For sweaters, especially for all textured yarns, use this method: Immerse 2 terry beach towels in warm water. Wring out towels. Place 1 towel on floor or blocking board. Place sweater or dress on towel. Pat to size. Cover sweater or dress with second towel. Steam top towel if desired. DO NOT PRESS.

How To Launder a Spinnerin "Orlon Sayelle" Garment Using a Washer-Dryer Combination:

Turn sweater inside out. Place in lingerie bag or pillow case. Set washer-dryer for 5 minute cycle or delicate fabric setting; high water level; medium to high drying temperature. Use any commercial detergent. Remove garment when it is completely dry. Dry at least 40 minutes.

How To Hand-Wash a Spinnerin "Orlon Sayelle" Garment:

1. Trace outline of garment on heavy paper and cut out.
2. Hand-wash in lukewarm water, using a light-hand scrubbing and any commercial detergent. Rinse in cold water.
3. "Squeeze". Do not wring.
4. Rinse again, using a softener.
5. Using terry towels, remove excess water. Repeat.
6. Slightly "bunch" garment on flat surface, not terry towels. Check size with paper cut-out. Let dry thoroughly.

Delightfully French

Style No. 702—Shown on page 5

These directions are written for small size (32-34). Changes for medium size (36-38) and large size (40-42) are in parentheses.

MATERIALS:

SPINNERIN Marvel Twist or Nylaine Germantown Knitting Worsted (4 oz. skeins) 4(4-5) skeins

OR SPINNERIN Alpine (50 gram balls) 10(11-12) balls

OR SPINNERIN Orlon Sayelle Express or Wintuk (2 oz. skeins) 10(11-12) skeins

OR SPINNERIN Frostlon Petite (1 oz. balls)

9(10-11) balls

1 each 29-inch circular knitting needle Nos. 5 and 8

1 d p or cable needle

7 buttons

GAUGE: 5 sts = 1 inch 7 rows = 1 inch

BODY MEASUREMENT: At bustline 33(37-41) inches.

SWEATER MEASUREMENT: At bustline 35(39-43) inches, buttoned.

SLEEVE WIDTH: 12½(13-13½) inches.

NOTE: Purl side of stockinette st (K 1 row, P 1 row) is right side of Cardigan.

With small circular needle cast on 179(199-219) sts for lower edge of Back and Fronts. Do not join. Work back and forth as on straight needles.

Row 1: K 1, * P 1, K 1; repeat from * to end.

Row 2: P 1, * K 1, P 1; repeat from * to end.

Repeat these 2 rows until piece measures ¾ inch. End with Row 1.

Next row: Work 3 sts, bind off next 3 sts for buttonhole on Right Front, work to end. *Next row:* Rib, casting on 3 sts over bound off sts. Continue in rib as established until piece measures 1¾ inches from beg, end with Row 2.

Next row: Work to within 8 sts of end, slip last 8 sts on a holder to be worked later for Right Front band.

Next row: Work to within 8 sts of end, slip last 8 sts to a holder to be worked later for Left Front Band. Change to large needle. Do not join. Work back and forth.

Work in stockinette st (K 1 row, P 1 row) on 163(183-203) sts until piece measures 11½ inches from beg, or desired length to underarms. End with a P row. *Next row:*

K 39(44-49) sts for Left Front, bind off next 4 sts for underarm, K until there are 77(87-97) from bind-off, bind off next 4 sts for underarm, K last 39(44-49) sts to end for Right Front. There are 39(44-49) sts on each Front and 77(87-97) sts on Back. Sl sts to holders or double strands of yarn.

SLEEVES: With small needle cast on 45(47-49) sts. Rib in K 1, P 1 for 2 inches, inc 6 sts evenly spaced across last row. There are 51(53-55) sts on needle. Change to large needle and work back and forth in stockinette st (P side is right side), inc 1 st each side every 1½ inches 6 times. Work even on 63(65-67) sts until sleeve measures 14½ inches from beg, or desired length to underarms. End with a P row. Bind off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Slip the 59(61-63) sts to a holder.

YOKE: *Next row:* K across 39(44-49) sts of Left Front; 59(61-63) sts of first Sleeve; 77(87-97) sts of Back; 59(61-63) sts of second Sleeve; 39(44-49) sts of Right Front. There are 273(297-321) sts on needle. Work pat as follows:

Row 1: P 4(5-6), * inc 2 sts in next st (K, P, K on front loop), P 23(25-27) sts; repeat from * 10 times more, inc 2 sts in next st, P 4(5-6). There are 12 pats.

Row 2: K 4(5-6), * P 3, K 23(25-27); repeat from * 10 times more, P 3, K 4(5-6).

Row 3: P 1(2-3), * inc 2 sts in next st, P 2, K 3, P 2, inc 2 sts in next st, P 8(9-10), P 2 tog, P 7(8-9); repeat from * 10 times more, inc 2 sts in next st, P 2, K 3, P 2, inc 2 sts in next st, P 1(2-3). There are 11 decs—1 st decreased between each pat.

Row 4: K 1(2-3), * P 3, K 2, P 3, K 2, P 3, K 16(18-20); repeat from * 10 times more, P 3, K 2, P 3, K 2, P 3, K 1(2-3).

Row 5: P 1(2-3), * K 3, P 2, K 3, P 2, K 3, P 16(18-20); repeat from * 10 times more, K 3, P 2, K 3, P 2, K 3, P 1(2-3).

Row 6: Repeat Row 4.

Row 7: P 1(2-3), * K 3, P 2, K 3, P 2, K 3, P 7(8-9), P 2 tog, P 7(8-9); repeat from * 10 times more, K 3, P 2, K 3, P 2, K 3, P 1(2-3). One st is decreased between each pat. There are 15(17-19) sts between pats.

Row 8: Work even in pat as established.

Row 9: Dec 1 st in center between each pat. There are 14(16-18) sts between pats.

Row 10: Work even in pat as established.

Row 11: Dec 1 st in center between each pat. There are 13(15-17) sts between pats.

Row 12: K 1(2-3), * P 3 tog, K 2, P 3 tog, K 2, P 3 tog, K 13(15-17); repeat from * 10 times more, P 3 tog, K 2, P 3 tog, K 2, P 3 tog, K 1(2-3).

Row 13: P 1(2-3), * sl next st to d p needle, hold at back of work, skip next 5 sts, pass right hand needle in back of skipped sts and K next st through back loop, and, leave on needle, P first skipped st, P 2nd skipped st, K next st, P next 2 sts, drop next st (already knitted) from left needle, K st from d p needle, P 13(15-17); repeat from * 11 times. End last repeat P 1(2-3) instead of P 13(15-17).

Row 14: K 1(2-3), * inc 2 sts in next st (P, K, P on front loop of st), K 2, inc 2 sts in next st, K 2, inc 2 sts in next st, K 13(15-17); repeat from * 11 times. End last repeat K 1(2-3) instead of K 13(15-17).

Row 15: P 1(2-3), * K 3, P 2, K 3, P 2, K 3, P 13(15-17); repeat from * 11 times. End last repeat P 1(2-3) instead of P 13(15-17).

Row 16: Work even in pat as established.

Row 17: Dec 1 st in center of each P 13(15-17) section between pats.

Rows 18 through 22: Work even in pat as established.

Row 23: P 1(2-3), * P 3 tog, P 2, K 3, P 2, P 3 tog, P 12(14-16); repeat from *. End last repeat P 1(2-3).

Row 24: K 4(5-6), * P 3, K 18(20-22); repeat from *. End last repeat K 4(5-6).

Row 25: P 4(5-6), * P 3 tog, P 18(20-22); repeat from *. End last repeat P 4(5-6). There are 218(242-266) sts on needle.

Row 26: K dec 12 sts evenly spaced across row. There are 206(230-254) sts on needle.

Next row (right side): K 2, * P 2, K 2; repeat from * to end.

Next row: P 2, * K 2, P 2; repeat from * to end. Repeat last 2 rows for 1½ inches. End on wrong side.

Next row: K 2, * P 2 tog, K 2; repeat from * to end.

Next row: P 2, * K 1, P 2; repeat from * to end.

Continue in rib pat as established until ribbing of Yoke measures 3½ inches. End on wrong side.

COLLAR (next row): Change to small needle. K 2 tog,

* P 1, K 2 tog; repeat from * to end. Continue in rib pat as established until Collar measures 4 inches. Bind off loosely in ribbing.

LEFT FRONT BAND: Slip the 8 sts from holder to smaller needle. Continue in rib pat until band, when slightly stretched, reaches to beg of Collar. Bind off in ribbing. Sew Band to Left Front edge, having top of Band at beg of Collar (neck edge).

Mark places for 7 buttons in center of Band, having first marker opposite buttonhole on Right Front, 7th marker ½ inch below top of Band and other 5 markers spaced evenly between these 2.

RIGHT FRONT BAND: Work to correspond to Left Front Band, working 6 more buttonholes opposite markers, same as first buttonhole. Sew Band to Front edge.

FINISHING: Sew Sleeve seams. Working from right side, work 1 row sl sts on front edge of Bands and Collar. Block. Sew on buttons.
